Key projects undertaken during year 2019-20

1. Link Worker Project

Under Gujarat AIDS Control Society "Link Worker Project" is working with 9 organizations in total 14 districts. As one of these organizations, "MoDe" operates in 100 villages of Vadodara and Chhotaudepur. HIV is more prevalent in remote areas where there is a lack of knowledge about HIV and AIDS, as well as amongst people who go out for months for employment, truck drivers.

MoDe India supports an effective implementation of LWS in 100 Villages of two districts of Gujarat viz. Vadodara and Chhotaudepur. Under this program, MoDe India works for building a rural community model for addressing the complex needs of HIV prevention, care and support requirements in selected geographies. The services include:

- Reaching out to rural population who are vulnerable and are at risk of HIV/AIDS in a non-stigmatized enabling environment.
 Improving access to information materials, commodities (condoms, needles/syringes) through collaborating with nearest TI or government health facilities, testing and treatment services ensuring there is no duplication of services or resources.
- Improving linkage to other social and health benefits provided by other line departments in line with local norms, regulations suitable for vulnerable populations.



The program mainly addresses areas like dissemination of information to

targeted community as per the guidelines of NACO, Free HIV testing, reporting of STDs, organizing health camps for STD treatment, referral to hospitals in case of seriousness. When a serious occult disease is found, he is referred to a government hospital.

The program is being implemented in 100 villages of both districts viz Vadodara and Chota Udepur. Village selection was done on the basis of village population, no. of people with high risk behaviour in the village, no of people vulnerable to HIV, No. of TB patients, No. of pregnant women and no. of people living with HIV/AIDS.

2.1 Vihaan Project

Named from the Sanskrit word 'dawn's first light,' Vihaan is a national initiative for improving the quality of life of people living with HIV (PLHIV) by expanding access to essential services, increase treatment adherence and reduce stigma and discrimination.

Vihaan program is being implemented in India since 2013 in all the States of India. This program is implemented by HIV/AIDS alliance and National AIDS Control Organization at Country level. In Gujarat, this program is being implemented by Gujarat State AIDS Control Society and Gujarat State Network of People Living with HIV/AIDS. Different organizations implement this program at District level. In some districts, it is also implemented by District level Networks.

Through Vihaan CSCs, range of quality care & support services are provided using an integrated approach that complements existing HIV prevention and treatment programming. Working in coordination with nearby ART Centres, the



CSCs serve as safe spaces for PLHIV offering services that include counselling, outreach and follow-up support, health referrals, and linkages to social welfare schemes. Vihaan CSCs is committed to the health and wellbeing of all PLHIV and their affected families, with special effort to reach those from underserved populations, including women, children and members of high-risk groups. The services offered under this program are:

Project Vastram

Clothing is not just a thing but is more special than that. Clothing is the protector of the human being; the clothing is a matter of belonging to both health and wellbeing.



Food, Clothing and Shelter are the basic necessities of human being, in which, our aim is to provide clothes to everyone. Due to economic limitations many people are unable to buy clothes for themselves and Vastram aims to provide clothes to such needy.

This program is being implemented since last 3 years i.e. from January 2018.

Currently the area of operations under this program is Ahmedabad but plan is to expand the outreach in Gujarat State.

Under this program, team Vastram and volunteers collect clothes from donors and distribute them amongst needy and



deserving beneficiaries. Upto December, approximately 20,000 clothes received from donors were distributed by the team and volunteers.



Capacity Building

Mode is strategically positioned as a partner of choice for WASH interventions. Mode has successfully led response to COVID-19 pandemic and created space for strengthening SBCC interventions. Risk communication and community engagement on sanitation and hand hygiene through multistakeholder partnerships with state and district government, UN agencies, CSRs and CSOs has been our forte.

MoDe India, as a consulting organization to AKHAI was instrumental in strengthening WASH in schools, Health centres and AWCs. Frontline functionaries of health, ICDS and education departments were trained on Infection Prevention Control Measures from WASH perspective, Operations & Maintenance of Hand Washing Stations installed at project locations & Segregation of Medical Waste. Under this initiative, total of 14 trainings were conducted in Ahmedabad and Surat districts. Over and above this, MoDe also imparted training in Devbhoomi Dwarka for Aga Khan Rural Support Program (AKRSP). These trainings were funded by Nayara Energy, a leading oil refinery company having its operations across India. MENTION JAMNAGAR AKAHI.

MoDe had also conducted trainings for District Resource Group (DRGs) under Nirmal Bharat Abhiyan. The training was supported by UNICEF, Gujarat. Elaborate with WASH perspective.

In partnership with UNICEF - Rajasthan, MoDe India took an initiative to support implementation of SBCC Interventions for acceleration and sustainability of Swachh Bharat Mission – Gramin, in four tribal Districts of Southern Rajasthan viz. Sirohi, Dungarpur, Banswara and Pratapgarh. The project sought institutionalised planning of Social and Behaviour Change Communication (SBCC) interventions within the district-wide Approach of SBM (G). The program focused on (a) development of SBCC action plan, (b) effective implementation with special focus on low performing GPs; (c) hand holding and supportive supervision (d) capacity building and system strengthening for SBCC, etc.

Training on Financial Literacy

Financial Literacy helps individuals gain financial knowledge that is directly linked to financial behavior. More importantly, financial knowledge becomes critical for poor and low-income families to build their personal and financial resources that they need to maintain self-sufficiency. Mahindra Finance, as a part of its CSR commitment organized financial literacy workshops along with Web based Mobile Application for sensitizing working population to inculcate good practices of money management. The project was implemented in collaboration with NIIT Foundation.

Under this project initiative, MoDe India was instrumental in organizing the workshops on "Financial And Digital Literacy – Dhan Samvaad" for the beneficiaries in the age group of 25 to 40 years with an income above Rs.10,000/- per month. During the period of 20-21, numbers of batches were organized wherein drivers, factory workers and number of beneficiaries were explained the importance of financial literacy and motivated to do their resource planning.

Currently we are instrumental for a series of online trainings for different categories including Drivers on Financial Literacy in partnership with NIIT Foundation, New Delhi (supported by Mahindra Finance). This is an one hour online / webinar to support Digital India Initiative on various topics i.e. Financial Management & COVID-19, Saving, Important of Insurance etc.
